






March Volunteer of the Month

Anti-Maleware Programs

With updates and upgrades these programs sometimes change and become either outdated or no longer useful for our needs, safety and security. We are, therefore, strongly recommending that members no longer use and immediately uninstall CCleaner from all desktops and laptops.

- 1. Click **Settings > Apps > Apps & features**.
- 2. Scroll through the list or use the search box to look for **CCleaner**.
- 3. Click **CCleaner**, then choose **Uninstall**.

Why Is CCleaner No Longer Safe?

CCleaner, once a tidy app with no history of issues, has had several major problems in less than a year. This is unfortunately not surprising after Avast purchased CCleaner developer Piriform in July 2017.

CCleaner Silently Forces Updates

The latest CCleaner controversy comes from ignoring user preferences about checking for updates. A user on Piriform's forums noticed that CCleaner had automatically updated on his system without his permission. As it turned out, that's exactly what happened.

Re: Apple Devices

Over the past year we have received a number of generous donations of Apple products for refurbishing/recycling for which we are very grateful. However, because of Apple's strong security, it is very difficult for us to refurbish iPad tablets and/or iPhones in preparation of forwarding them on to needy recipients. Former owners <u>need to disconnect</u> their email logons and passwords from iCloud & "Find My Phone" prior to donation. Without this step, it creates a major hurdle for us to factory reset the device and forward it to someone in need.

Below is information on how to disconnect your IPad or IPhone device as published by Apple.
