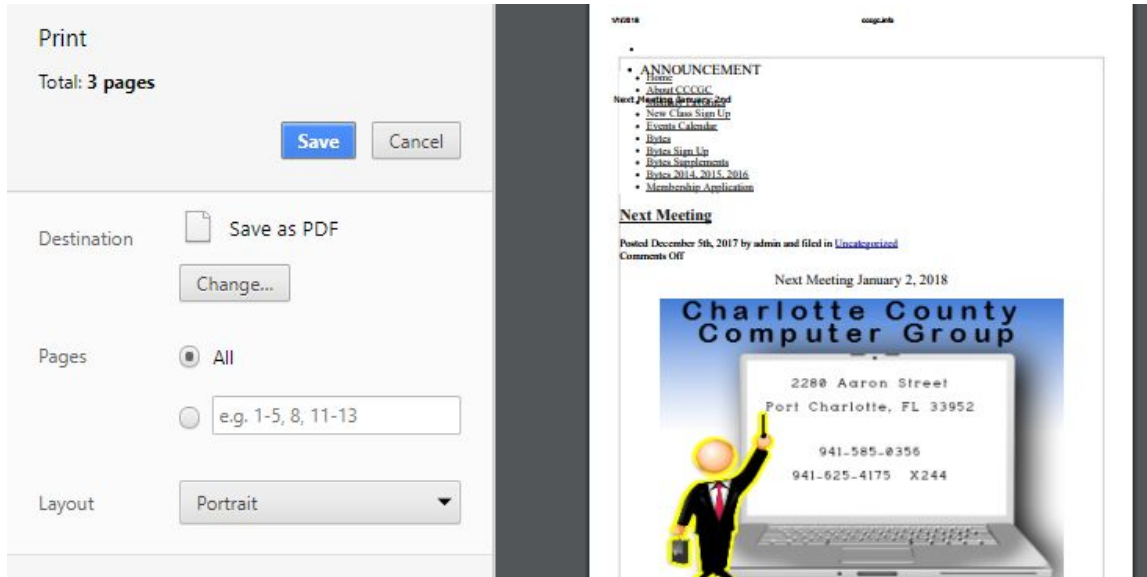

Printing a Webpage

PrtScr on the keyboard will print just what is visible on the screen. The results will be found in the clipboard unless you hold down the Windows key, then an image will be created in the Screenshot folder in your Pictures folder.

Right-click and choose **Print**; prints the entire page

Sending a Webpage by email

What if I want to send the page to someone else in an email?

Ctrl+P (or right-click > Print) and choose **Save as PDF**. Locate the file in Downloads, then attach that file to the email.

Or send them the URL located in the Address Bar on the browser window. **Ctrl+L** will jump the cursor to the address bar and select the entire URL. Just **Copy > Paste** it into the email. If it is a very long URL, shorten it with [Tinyurl.com](https://tinyurl.com)



Using Data from the Web

There are times when we might need to take data located on a website and use it in a spreadsheet to look at the data differently; to analyze it, total columns, figure out percentage or averages.

This is easily done using **copy > paste**. All you need is a web page with numerical data. Perhaps your credit card data, bank account data, etc.

I use GasBuddy to locate the lowest price for gasoline in the area. I also use it to track my purchases.

I select the data I want and **right-click > copy**

Then I open a spreadsheet and **right-click > paste** into the first cell (A1)

After pasting I can remove the columns I do not need and format the sheet.

I can add calculations to determine how many fill ups, total amount spent, total gallons used, lowest price paid, highest price paid, and more.

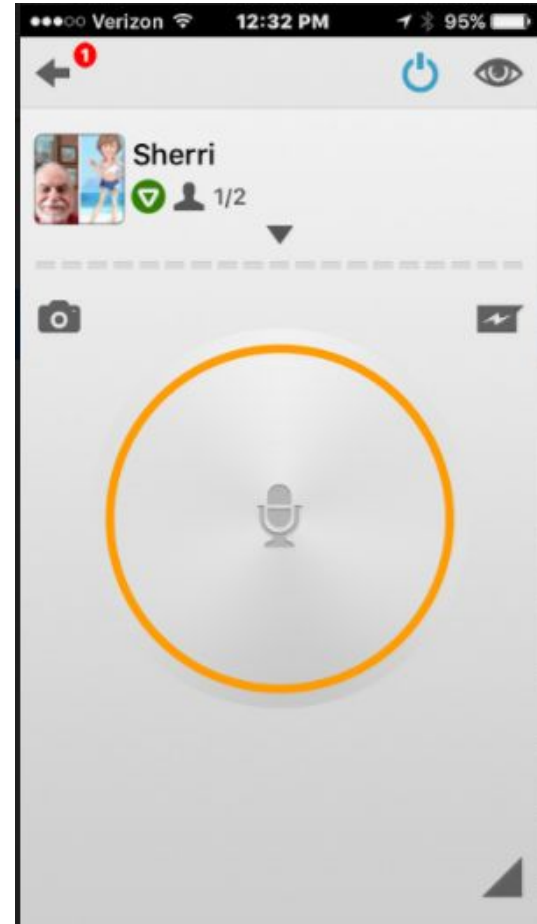
Walkie Talkie App

Adding Captions

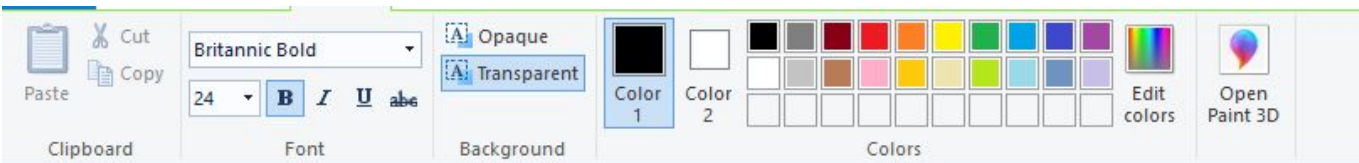
We have all those pictures we took this last month. We can add tags and add descriptions on Facebook but how do we do that to send a picture to someone else?

There are many programs on and off line that will help you. I find the simple Paint program that has been in Windows forever does the job for me.



Adding Captions

1. Open the photo in Paint
2. Add white space under the image
3. Insert a text box in that white space
4. Type the caption
5. Save the photo

Adding Captions
