

# **By Law Changes**

**8.2** A Nominating Committee Chairperson A chairperson shall be appointed by the President no later than the regular membership meeting on the first Tuesday in September. The Chairperson may establish a Nominating Committee. The Nominating Committee shall prepare a slate of nominees for the elective offices, provide each nominee with a copy of the Bylaws; then provide the slate of nominees to the Newsletter Editor for inclusion in the November newsletter and or other communication. At the general meeting in November, additional nominations will be solicited may be made from the floor and accepted, provided that the nominees indicate concurrence with their names being placed in nomination. To provide maximum transparency in the voting process, the candidates identified by the Nominating Committee, by self-nomination, or nominations made and accepted on the floor, should be the standard to allow candidates to be properly identified on the printed ballot. The use of write-in ballots however is allowed.

**8.2.1** The election will take place at the annual meeting of the membership in December and will be supervised by the Nominating Committee. Voting shall be by secret ballot. Ballots shall not be marked in any way that would permit tracking or the perception of tracking of the ballots to a voting member. Members of the nominating committee shall retain close control of ballots, allocating one ballot per voting member, and collecting the ballots for counting by members of the Nominating Committee. Write-in votes for candidates, not previously identified, shall be accepted if clearly legible and the candidate is a member in good standing in the Corporation. Selection of winners for all positions shall be by plurality i.e., receiving the most cast votes. In the event of a tie, the winner will be selected by the drawing of lots, such as selecting the short straw.

To avoid the appearance of coercion, campaigning of members to secure votes shall not occur within the building of the election.

8.2.2 The Chairperson of the Nomination Committee will announce the results

To the members as soon as possible immediately at the meeting and will have provide them to be posted, in the January issue of the newsletter or other communication. Any irregularities in the election process shall be identified promptly to the President and to the existing board members. A copy of the election results shall be given to the Secretary for inclusion into the permanent record of the Corporation.

Directors and Officers shall be elected by a majority vote of the members voting in person.

In the event an office is contested, any nominee may request a recount of the ballots. Paper ballots shall be retained for not less than 30 days after an election and uploaded to the cloud for permanent retention, along with the summary results of the voting. After that, the paper ballots may be destroyed.

### Upgrading from Windows 10 To Windows 11

If you are running Windows 10 on a PC that meets Windows 11's stringent requirements, you should be seeing the following message under Windows Update (Settings > Update & Security > Windows Update):

Windows 11 Ready Message

If you've been putting off upgrading for some reason, perhaps now is a good time to rethink.

Should You Upgrade To Windows 11 Now?

### Should You Upgrade To Windows 11 Now?

In my opinion, if your PC running Windows 10 meets Windows 11 requirements, you should seriously consider upgrading now. Here's why:

Windows 10 reaches end-of-support in October 2025 (a mere two years away) at which time you'll need to upgrade to Windows 11, run an unsupported (insecure) Windows 10, or install Linux.

Bearing that in mind, and with the likely advent of a Windows 12. The differences between Windows 10 and Windows 11 are not overly significant, and the differences between Windows 11 and Windows 12 will probably not be overly significant either. However, the differences between Windows 10 and Windows 12 will almost certainly be significant.

My point is, that upgrading now will give you plenty of time to familiarize yourself with Windows 11 making the eventual transition to Windows 12 (or whatever Microsoft decides to name it) a lot more palatable.

I'm currently running Windows 10 and Windows 11 on separate internal SSDs and, in my opinion, Windows 11 is a very good operating system. Sure, Windows 11 has some minor issues, but it is still under active development with frequent feature updates, and improving all the time.

What operating system are you running? If one of the older operating systems, are you thinking of upgrading? Let us know in the comments.


