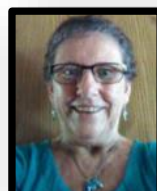

### January's Presentation

January's presentation was made by Mark Krider. It was titled, **Smishing, Phishing, and Vishing. And let's not forget Pig Butchering.** In it Mark talks about how people get scammed and what to look out for. Be careful what you click on. If you don't recognize the source, don't click on it. Try to look at the email address of the person who sent you the message. If it's from someone at gmail.com, you know it's not from your bank. If in doubt, you're better off calling the company that supposedly wants you to click on something, directly. Ask them if they sent the email. If not, delete it. If they did then you can probably resolve the issue without clicking on the email links.

Finally, if you get flashing screens telling you that you've been hacked and that you need to call Microsoft, don't do it. It's a scam. There's a chance your computer is okay but your browser (Chrome, Firefox or Edge etc.) has been hijacked. **Don't click on anything and don't call them.** Bring the machine into the office and let us look at it. You may also be able to turn off the machine by holding the power button until it quits.

### Backing Up With Macrium?

Are you backing up your computer with Macrium? I am. Everyone should be aware that the free version of Macrium is no longer supported by the company. It still works but that's the issue. I can see a scenario where the software continues to backup as expected but in a worst case scenario where your computer crashes, you might not be able to recover your system. Why? Because the free version of the software hasn't changed in a couple of years while the operating systems, Windows 10 and 11 have.

The point is we should all probably start looking for a replacement. To that end, here's a piece of free software that may be a suitable replacement. Hasleo Software makes free backup and cloning tools for Windows.

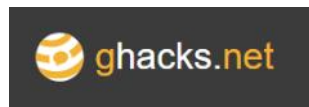
